# Comet Simulator ready for take off!

Fifty years to the day that scheduled jet transatlantic passenger flights began, the 9<sup>th</sup> Erith Air Scouts recreated the occasion on a newly restored flight simulator.



The restored Comet cockpit simulator at the Scout Aviation Centre, Biggin Hill Airport, was officially opened on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> October. The Comet simulator carries the same registration – G-APDB - as the first Comet to undertake the service from New York to London on 4 October 1958.

For the last 8 months Ian Thomas and his team from 9<sup>th</sup> Erith Air Scouts have been bringing this simulator back to life and linking it into a computer running Microsoft Flight Simulator X along with projecting the view of the outside world through the cockpit windows.

The simulator can now be used by Scouts who visit the centre. A typical 'flight' allows young people to take off from Biggin and then fly over London to land at Heathrow which will take them about 15 minutes. During the whole flight, the Scouts will be in charge, 'flying' the simulator from the captain and first officer seats with minimal intervention from the adult instructor.

The Scout Aviation Centre is crewed by Air Scouts from Greater London South and Greater London South East . It provides air training to members of the Scout Association from across England and to other youth groups. For more information please contact lan Piperianp@pbmail.co.uk

# **Cubs experience Firepower**

Ninety-one Sidcup Cubs visited Firepower, The Royal Artillery Museum based at Woolwich.

With Cubs divided into groups of 15, our group started with military drill. They were shown how to march, stand at ease, to attention and about turn; as



our solder Neil barked out the orders, including the 'wait for it' trap, the Cubs marched to and fro. Stopping is no easier, stop out of step and the first Cub gets marched on or overtaken!

Next was a visit to the 'bomb damaged' Breech cinema where we where shown the history of the Royal Arsenal, and, being interactive, the chance to 'blow up' a tank with a special effects rocket.

After lunch, it was time to 'Hunt the Horrible'. The Cubs were given a list of things to find in the Gunnery Hall, including a Roman Coffin, a dead tortoise, 108 year old bar of Chocolate and teeth from an elephant...

This was followed by The Field of Fire, a theatre in the round showing the history of artillery from Victorian times to the present day complete with multi sound and visual effects.

The day finished with a bang, quite literally with Each Cub having the chance to fire a 1914, 25 pounder field cannon; with blanks I must point out otherwise they would be nothing left of Woolwich!
